- 1. The guideline here is based on the play most likely to happen.
- 2. The crew needs to communicate and work together at all times.
- 3. WBSC umpires do not work together an entire season. Therefore mechanics are kept simple and consistent all over the world.
- 4. The practice of rimming is an acceptable practice for WBSC umpires.
- 5. In many cases umpires have to split the difference and react.
- 6. Most important is trust your instincts.




Basic Principles in 4 Umpire Mechanics:

- Overthrows




